TAX SURVEY of the 99th ILLINOIS GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2015-2016



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is the 17th biennial, non-partisan Illinois Tax Survey compiled by Taxpayers United of America (TUA). For 41 years, TUA has educated taxpayers while publicizing all significant tax and spending increases voted on by the Illinois General Assembly. This edition analyzes the 99th General Assembly of Illinois.

Since the Illinois Supreme Court ruled significant and meaningful government pension reform legislation unconstitutional, the state's finances have continued to fair poorly. Currently, the top pensioner in Illinois, Leslie Heffez, a former UIC professor now in private practice, collects a pension more than a half-million dollars from taxpayers annually!

Three bills in our 17th Tax Survey involve the legislature attempting to saddle Illinois taxpayers with even greater liabilities, easily totaling more than a half-billion tax dollars. SB 2822 and SB 2437 were both attempts by the Illinois General Assembly to bailout the perpetually disastrous Chicago Public School Teachers' pensions. Mercifully, Republican Gov. Bruce Rauner vetoed both bills and the Illinois General Assembly failed to override his veto. However, SB 777, the Chicago Firefighters Pension Bailout, re-amortized the pension debt of the Chicago Fire pension fund and although Rauner vetoed it, both chambers overrode his veto May 30, 2016.

Other bills included in TUA's 17th biennial Tax Survey were vetoed by Rauner but overridden by the legislature's tax-loving and spendthrift super majority, including SB 2043, a single piece of legislation that appropriated \$721 million for college grants. Unfortunately, this is not uncommon. This is exactly how Illinois became one of the worst financial catastrophes amongst the fifty states. The only good news in this case is that the house failed to pass the override bill so the veto stands.

Not a single member of the Senate – no Republican, no Democrat – received a passing score of 70% or more

on this Tax Survey, which is stunning! The Republicans scored better in both chambers, 41% in the Senate and 66% in the House, whereas the Democrats maxed out at 4% in the House – and only 1% in the Senate! How is that even possible? Well, numerous Democrats voted against taxpayers on nearly every vote during this session, so the overall scores were exceptionally low.

Thankfully, 32 members of the House passed the Tax Survey with a score of 70% or more in voting against higher spending and taxation. However, five of the aforementioned are not our friends as they subsequently voted for a \$5 Billion income tax increase in the 100th general assembly.

Gov. Rauner outclassed his predecessor, disgraced former Democratic Gov. Pat Quinn, who received a sorry 10% on TUA's 16th biennial Tax Survey. Gov. Rauner is the first Illinois Governor to score above 70% on the TUA tax survey and we are pleased to feature him on the list of Taxpayer Friends.

Gov. Rauner's score was on par with an A- at 92%. He has the highest score ever achieved by an Illinois Governor since 1983. We congratulate Gov. Rauner in accomplishing this feat. Please note, in calculating this score SB2196 was not included, as the bill has been tabled indefinitely.

A roll call of every legislator and how they voted on each significant tax or spending bill surveyed for this session begins on page 4. Legislators' scores are normalized and range from 0% to 100%, indicating how often they supported taxpayers by voting against tax and spending increases. The best scoring legislators voted against all tax and spending increases and are included on the list of Taxpayers' Friends on page 7, while those who most often voted against taxpayers are included on the list of Taxpayers' Enemies on page 8.

TUA has used the same methodology to evaluate each lawmaker's record since publishing its first Tax Survey in 1983.

BILL SUMMARIES

SB 2437 – Chicago Pension Protection Act

Raises property taxes to prop up Chicago pensions. It's a sweet deal for pensioners but a bitter pill for taxpayers, as it would cost at least \$215 million to taxpayers and sweeten government pensions by allowing retirement 2 years sooner. Those hired after 2011 would get this plum deal without paying an additional penny.

Passed Senate 4/21/2016.

Passed House 12/1/2016.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 3/24/2017. Veto stands.

HB 580 – AFSCME Benefits Bill

Ridiculous demands on taxpayers that would have codified additional benefits for AFSCME members and cut taxpayers out of collective bargaining by nullifying the governor's role, not to mention the outrageous increases in pay for this narrow group of government employees.

Passed House 2/16/2016.

Passed Senate 3/3/2016.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 5/16/2016. House fails to override. Veto stands.

SB 2043 – Taxpayer-funded College Grants

An appropriations bill that authorizes \$721 million in unfunded benefits in the form of college grants. Vetoed by Gov. Rauner but override bill was passed by the Senate, although the veto stands as the override measure failed to pass the House.

Passed Senate 8/19/2015.

Passed House 1/28/2016.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 2/19/2016.

Senate overrode veto 3/2/2016, but House failed to override on 3/2/2016. Veto stands.

SB 2822 – \$215 Million CPS Bailout

This legislation would have given \$215 million in taxpayer dollars stolen from taxpayers throughout the state in a misguided effort to shore up the Chicago Public

Schools bankrupt pension system without any pension reform included. Vetoed by Gov. Rauner.

Passed Senate 4/21/2016.

Passed House 6/30/2016.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 12/1/2016.

Senate overrode veto 12/1/2016, but the House failed to do so. Veto stands.

SB 777 – Chicago Firefighters Pension Bailout

This bill kicks the can down the road by re-amortizing the pension debt of the Chicago Fire pension fund.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner but overridden by the veto-proof house of the 99th Illinois General Assembly.

Passed Senate 4/16/2015.

Passed House 5/30/2015.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 5/27/2016, but the Senate and House overrode Gov. Rauner's veto on 5/30/2016.

SB 2046 – \$4 Billion Higher Education Tax Hike

Appropriates \$3.89 billion of taxpayer money for higher education and social services. Vetoed, mercifully, by Gov. Rauner.

Passed Senate 9/9/2015.

Passed House 4/12/2016.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 6/10/2016. Neither the Senate nor the House had the votes to override. Veto stands.

SB 1229 – AFSCME Protection Plan

The bill would have helped AFSCME but cheated taxpayers by stripping Gov. Rauner of negotiating power with government unions. If the legislation would have passed, the governor would have been removed from the negotiating table in future discussions over pay and benefits for AFSCME members.

Passed Senate 4/22/2015.

Passed House 5/29/2015.

Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 7/29/2015.

Senate voted to override veto 8/19/2015, but the House failed to override on 9/2/2015. Veto stands.

SB 2196 – Higher Education Handout for Undocumented Immigrants

Provides tuition assistance for undocumented immigrants by making them eligible for state grants for higher education.

Passed Senate 4/20/2016 but failed to go to a vote in the House.

SB 2931 – Home Healthcare Minimum Wage Hike

Requires employers to pay no less than \$15 an hour to home healthcare workers that provide care to people with disabilities, effectively reducing the number of hours of care available to these people.

Passed Senate 5/11/2016.
 Passed House 5/18/2016.
 Vetoed by Gov. Rauner 7/22/2016.
 Senate overrode the veto 11/16/2016, but the House failed to do so. Veto stands.

HB 5736 – Medicaid Expansion Bill

Postpones, for 3 years, the sunset of a program that provides healthcare for qualifying children, including undocumented immigrants. This is less about the kids and more about ensuring Illinois receives federal dollars to Medicaid as a component of Obamacare.

Passed House 4/19/2016.
 Passed Senate 5/3/2016.
 Gov. Rauner approved 6/30/2016.
