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TAX SURVEY of the 97th ILLINOIS GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2011 - 2012



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is the 15th biennial, non-partisan Illinois Tax Survey compiled by Taxpayers United of America. For 37 years, TUA has been educating taxpayers while fighting all significant tax and spending increases voted on by the Illinois General Assembly. This edition analyzes the 97th General Assembly of Illinois.

The 97th General Assembly accomplished little to improve the tax landscape for Illinois residents. The most notable piece of legislation to come out of this group was SB3314. This bill, introduced by Don Harmon (D) Oak Park, was the direct result of the lawsuits filed by TUA against Oak Park D-97 and Wilmette D-39 school districts for using ballot language that purposely mislead taxpayers by understating by 300%, the property tax increase resulting from passage of a property tax increase referendum. SB3314 makes this practice of duping voters illegal.

While tax cuts are normally a great accomplishment to be celebrated, SB0397 is a tax cut only for two of Illinois' largest companies, CME and Sears. Under the threat of leaving the state, these two employers were given special consideration so they would stay in Illinois. This is nothing more than corporate welfare.

What of the companies that aren't big enough to hold the state hostage? They will quietly leave, with their jobs and their tax revenue. And let's not forget that for every dollar of discount given to the big fish, another dollar must be collected from the small fish!

Why is it so difficult for Quinn, Madigan and Cullerton to recognize that the temporary 4 year 30% corporate tax increase and the 67% personal income tax surcharge were bad for all Illinoisans, not just the big fish?

But the real legacy of this 97th General Assembly is the

ignorance of any government pension reform. This can was kicked down the road. Again. While lawmakers nickel and dime us with increased license plate taxes and numerous speed and red light cameras, they fail to reform the very problem that is bankrupting the state and causing residents to flee in droves. 2012 saw a net loss of productive residents, the ones who work and pay taxes, of 74,000.

A roll call of every legislator and how they voted on each significant spending or taxation bill begins on page 4. Legislators are given a score from 0% to 100% indicating how often they voted to support taxpayers. The best scoring legislators are included on the list of Taxpayer Friends on page 7, while those who most often voted against taxpayers are included on the list of Taxpayer Enemies on page 7.

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

SB3314 – Amends the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law in the Property Tax Code. Provides that the approximate amount of the tax extendable should be calculated using the most recent equalization factor certified to the county clerk by the Department of Revenue. This amendment was a direct result of TUA's lawsuits holding government schools accountable for deceiving voters by understating the proposed tax increase by 300%.

Sponsored in the Senate by Don Harmon. Sponsored in the House by Michael Zalewski (D-21, Summit), and Keith Farnham (D-43, Elgin).

Passed by the Senate May 23, 2012. Passed by the House, May 30, 2012. Signed by Governor Quinn on August 24, 2012.

TAX INCREASES

SB2194 Cigarette Tax Increase - The tobacco tax rate hike raises the tax by \$1 per pack, making the Illinois tax rate 15th highest in the nation despite irrefutable evidence that raising cigarette taxes decreases revenues and increases crime by shifting demand to the black market.

Sponsored in the Senate by Dan Kotowski (D-33, Park Ridge) and Sue Rezin (R-38, Peru). Sponsored in the House by Lisa Dugan (D-79, Kankakee), and Karen Yarbrough (D-7, Broadview).

Passed by the House May 25, 2012, the Senate on April 15, 2012 and signed by Governor Quinn on June 14, 2012.

SB1566 License Tax Increase - \$55 million dollar tax increase on license plate renewal requires taxpayers to pay an additional \$2 to renew license plates.

Sponsored in the Senate by David Koehler (D-46, Pekin) and Terry Link (D-30, Lincolnshire). Sponsored in the House by Linda Chapa LaVia (D-83, Aurora) and William Davis (D-30 East Hazel Crest).

SB0965 Speed Camera Bill - Allows the City of Chicago to once again use the 'safety of the kids' as an excuse to issue speeding tickets from the comfort of their office by allowing speed cameras to be mounted near city schools and parks. This is a revenue generator to fund city pensions and has nothing to do with keeping kids safe.

Sponsored in the Senate by Martin Sandoval (D-12, Cicero). Sponsored in the House by Barbara Currie (D-25, Chicago).

Passed by the Senate on October 26, 2011, the House November 09, 2011 and signed by Governor Quinn on February 06, 2012.

SPENDING INCREASES

HB3697 - Throws good money after bad by appropriating close to a billion dollars to the state's failing pension systems. Check out the top 100 government pensions in the

Passed by the House on April 1, 2011, the Senate on April 15, 2011 and signed by Governor Quinn on June 30, 2011.

HB0116 - Appropriates even more of our hard-earned money to the State Universities' Retirement System, home of the highest government pensions in the state. Sponsored in the House by Tom Cross (R-84, Plainfield). Sponsored in the Senate by John M. Sullivan (D-47, Quincy), David Koehler (D-46, Pekin) and Michael Frerichs (D-52, Champaign).

Passed by the House April 01, 2011, the Senate on April 15, 2011 and signed by Governor Quinn on June 30, 2011.

HB3639 - Appropriates funds from the General Revenue Fund to the Teachers Retirement System. A millionaire's club of epic proportions!

Sponsored in the House by Tom Cross (R-84, Plainfield) and Carol Sente (D-59 Lincolnshire). Sponsored in the Senate by John M. Sullivan (D-47, Quincy), David Koehler (D-46, Pekin) and Michael Frerichs (D-52, Champaign).

Passed by the House March 31, 2011, the Senate on April 15, 2011 and signed by Governor Quinn on June 30, 2011.

HB3813 - Stops union bosses from gaming the system in order to be eligible for lucrative, taxpayer-funded pensions.

Sponsored in the House by Donald L. Moffitt (R-74, Galesburg) and Pam Roth (R-75, Morris). Sponsored in the Senate by Ron Sandack (R-21, Lombard) and Dan Kotowski (D-33, Park Ridge).

Passed by the Senate November 10, 2011, the House

November 29, 2011 and signed by Governor Quinn on January 25, 2012.

Sponsored in the Senate by Dan Kotowski (D-33 Park Ridge) and John Sullivan (D-47, Quincy). Sponsored in the House by Michael Madigan (D-22, Chicago).

Passed by the House May 31, 2012 and the Senate November 28, 2012. Signed by Governor Quinn December 4, 2012.

SPENDING CUTS

HB1353 & HB3810 - Quinn's Amendatory veto of HB1353 resulted in an attempt to make sure that scholarships "paid for by the taxpayers of Illinois should go to only those in financial need, not to those with political connections." The newly revised HB3810 passed.

Sponsored in the House by Naomi Jakobsson (D-103, Champaign), Jerry Costello II (D-116, Sparta), and John Sullivan (D-47, Quincy). Sponsored in the Senate by Dave Syverson (R-34, Rockford) and Wm. Sam McCann (R-49, Carlinville).

Passed by the Senate May 03, 2012, the House on May 21, 2012 and signed by Governor Quinn on July 11, 2012.

TAX CUTS

SB0397 Corporate tax Rollback - After the business-killing Corporate Tax Hike, the threat of exodus by CME Group and Sears brought about the corporate tax rollback. While tax cuts are usually good, this one is actually a subsidy of two of the largest Illinois businesses. Every business should get a tax cut!

Sponsored in the House by John Bradley (D-117, Marion) and Joe Sosnowski (R-69, Belvidere). Sponsored in the Senate by William Brady (R-44, Bloomington) and James Clayborne (D-57, East St. Louis).

Passed by the House December 12, 2011, the Senate December 13, 2011 and signed by Governor Quinn December 16, 2011.

SB1313 Tax Cut – This bill gives the governor the authority to mandate retirees to make payments for their own healthcare premiums. However, in an effort not to anger his cronies and union buddies, he has failed to save taxpayers billions by forcing taxpayers to continue to fund up to 100% of government retirees' healthcare.

Passed by the House on May 9, 2012, the Senate on May 10, 2012 and signed by Governor Quinn on June 21, 2012.

OTHER TAXES

HJRCA0049 - Requires that a pension benefit increase has 3/5 vote by the members elected to each house of the General Assembly. This is smoke and mirrors and would have done absolutely nothing to curb the pension crisis. Overwhelming majorities in the house and senate have approved every pension increase! The voters were not fooled though; this amendment to the Illinois Constitution was defeated at the polls.

Sponsored in the House by Fred Crespo (D-44, Streamwood). Sponsored in the Senate by Jeffrey Schoenberg (D-9, Evanston).

Both Houses adopted the bill but Illinois voters narrowly rejected the constitutional amendment on November 6, 2012.
